Facts on EOP

- Roosevelt immediately proposed a vast number of federal programs to deal with the country's serious economic problems during the great depression created the EOP
- the council of economic advisors helps the president formulate the nation's economic policy, proposes solutions to problems, aids other executive agencies etc.
- roosevelt passed the recognition act of 1939 that benefited him in regards to continuing with his plans
- All of these has helped the EOP grow rapidly
 - Every president has reorganized it
 - President needed experts to to advise
 - EOP staff members have been added to help coordinate these efforts

Define:

- the Bureau of the Budget
- Central clearance

Things to remember

- The Council of Economic Advisers: helps the president formulate the nation's economy and prepares the annual reports that include Economic Report of the president.
- EOP Agencies: The Domestic Policy Council, The National Economic Council, The Office of Environmental Policy
- Department of Homeland Security: Was created in November 2002 in response to the September 11 attacks (want to protect the U.S. from any further attacks)
- National Security Council (1947): Created to advise the President and help coordinate American military and foreign policy
- White House Staff: Remember some of the important duties they have such as performing whatever duties the president assigns them
